

Supporting GLP Language Development



- <u>Affirm all repetitions/scripts</u>, even sounds (repeat everything back with the same intonation and enthusiasm)
- Try to reduce or avoid asking questions

Instead of	Try saying
What are you playing with?	Wow! It's a Car!
Where is the Bus?	Look! It's a Bus!
Are you riding a Bike?	Brrrooooom, Let's go!

GET CURIOUS



- Say less.. instead REALLY FOCUS ON THEIR PLAY
- Become the observer, not the intervenor
- Think about their favourite TV shows, songs, stories...
- Pay attention to the source of their scripts and then use them!



FOLLOW YOUR CHILD IN THEIR PLAY

- Get creative with their special interest play
 - o like putting their "favourite things" up on the wall using painter tape
- Present the interest in a <u>new container/ new location</u>
 - like bubbles in a new bubble container
- Offer the special interest in <u>different forms</u>
 - like letters as cards, wooden letters and a puzzle
- While playing, use simple easy functional phrases



	DO NOT -	ignore	their	attempts	to	comm	unicate
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- ☐ DO NOT consider their scripted phrases and echolalia as speech
- ☐ DO NOT say: "say..." "Tell me..."
- □ DO NOT ask questions
- ☐ DO NOT use long and complex statements
- ☐ DO NOT force them to use only verbal mode to communicate. If they use gestures or AAC, always acknowledge their attempts
- ☐ DO NOT focus on teaching grammar or expect perfect grammar
- ☐ DO NOT rush them to respond to your comments
- ☐ DO NOT focus on their faults
